## LITURGY

### SAME MASS



**Question: Is it true to say that the Mass is the same in every church?**

Yes and no. The basic structure is the same.

The readings assigned for the day are the same in every Catholic Church (and even followed in some Protestant churches). There will be variations in the ritual and these are based on local customs. For example, if you were to go to Mass in the southwestern U.S. where the people were predominately Hispanic, there would be different (and probably more) music and maybe even a Mariachi band. The structure and the words would be the same. Each faith community has its own local customs that help them express their worship. For example, in some parishes the people hold hands during the Our Father. The fact that other churches may not do that does not make it right or wrong, just different.

## VACATION

This is vacation time for many people. You can always tell by the number of people who are away during the summer. Vacations are times when we can relax and reflect and enter into a new kind of pace that will help us see our lives in a different way. Jesus says: "Come to me, all you who are weary and find life burdensome, and I will refresh you." Vacation time, wherever it is taken, can and should be a time to be RE-CREATED. We certainly see it as a time to be renewed physically ... how about spiritually? Perhaps we could make a special effort to welcome those people who are in our midst as vacationers, visitors, or tourists. ## In Our Own Time and Place

The road Jesus takes to Jerusalem is signposted with encounters, events, and stopping places, without any logical or geographical progression. This serves to universalize the way of discipleship, which has nothing to do with map reading or chronology and everything to do with following Jesus in our own time and place. To help us along the way, Luke describes three encounters with would-be disciples.

The first takes the initiative in approaching Jesus. He is a brashly confident enthusiast who needs to be tested for staying power. If you want to follow me, says Jesus, be prepared to be a powerless, dispossessed follower of a rejected Son of Man.

In the second encounter, it is Jesus who takes the initiative in calling the person to follow. We probably have a sneaking sympathy for this one who seems to make a very human and religious request of Jesus: "Let me go and bury my father first." In Jesus' invitation was the urgent and present call not to delay, not to put off the "today" demands of the reign of God.

The third would-be disciple wants to follow Jesus, but on condition that he is allowed to "first say farewell to those at home." This seems a reasonable request, especially in the light of the first reading that describes how Elijah gave Elisha permission to go and say good-bye. But the following of Jesus has to be unswerving; not even this detour is allowed.

In all these encounters, we hear the requests, we listen to Jesus' response, but we learn nothing of the outcome of the meetings. It is as though Jesus is saying to us by this narrative silence; Listen to the answer your own life makes.
